

violence". This has spawned much falsehood, corruption, communal massacres and even wars. Dr. Madhu Pant spoke of her great challenge in translating this book into Hindi in view of its broad spectrum contents which dealt not only with leaders and events in India but from all over the world. She stated that she had been transformed in the process.





