The highlights of the broad spectrum activities during this period were the launch of the SIT Rajasthan Chapter and the keynote address delivered by the SIT Managing Trustee at the International Day of Non Violence event at the UN in New York on October 2, 2012.

The Rajasthan Chapter, the eleventh Chapter of Sarvodaya International Trust, was launched at Jaipur on January 30, 2013. Its office bearers and Trustees are: Chairman: Mr. D.R. The title of the keynote address delivered by Managing Trustee Pascal Alan Nazareth was 'Gandhi: The Non Violent Revolutionary'. The event was held at the UN ECOSOC Chamber and was chaired by India's Minister of External Affairs Sri S.M.Krishna. Among those present on the occasion were Mr Vuk Jeremic, President of the UN General Assembly and the Permanent Representatives to the UN of 52 countries including those of the UK, France, Belgium, Pakistan, Bangaldesh, Saudi Arabia, Morocco & Iraq.

The President of the General Assembly, H.E. Mr. Vuk Jeremic urged the international community to 'keep trying to think and act like the Mahatma - and to apply the philosophy of Non Violence to the decisions we make'. He stated that he had chosen the overarching theme of 'bringing about settlement of international disputes by peaceful means'. for the General Assembly's work for the next twelve months.

In his address, Mr. Nazareth elucidated the transformation of Gandhi from youthful timidity into the intrepid Mahatma who successfully confronted first white racialism in South Africa and then the British Empire in India, with only 'Truth Force' which subsequently used by Martin Luther King, Lech Walesa and others had brought about spectacular political and social changes all over the world, validating Johan Galtung's assertion that Gandhi had "revolutionized revolution itself" Recalling Gandhi's message to

the United Nations, on the eve of its establishment, he called upon all members of the UN, particularly the P5, to "shed their belief in the efficacy of war and its accompanying terrible deception and fraud". The news reports carried this sentence as the punch line of his

address.

As in previous years, Gandhi Jayanti was joyfully celebrated with concerts ofmusic and dance in New Delhi, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Mumbai, Ahmedabad, Goa, Jummu, Bhubaneshwar and Kanchipuram. Brief details of these concerts, organized by SIT Regional Chapters, are as under:

The New Delhi Chapter presented an innovative and impactful



Bharatanatyam dance presentation titled 'Gandhi: Warp and Weft' by the talented Geeta Chandran at the Chinmayananda Auditorium. With A charpoy kept as a backdrop and using khadi thread as a metaphor she recapitulated Gandhi life and message, his spinning the charkha, his imprisonment, his patient step by step liberation of India and emancipation of oppressed sections of its society and finally his

assassination, with his favourite bhajan 'Vaishnava jan to' softly played as back ground music. The veteran dance critic Sunil Kothari lauded it as "wonderful presentation on Gandhi" and urged that it be presented at other venues also.

At Bangalore, the Gandhi Jayanti Ahimsa Mahotsav on October 2nd

was held at the Raj Bhavan Glass House and nationally telecast by Bangalore Doordarshan Kendra on its Chandana channel. It featured the renowned Bharatnatayam dancer Srimathi Padmaja Suresh and her troupe in a specially choreographed



dance presentation titled 'Ahimsa Shakti. The Governor of Karnataka Mr. Hansraj Bharadwaj and Mrs Bharadwaj were Chief Guests at this event which was attended by over a thousand personsamong whom were the Bangalore based Consuls General of the UK, Germany and Russia. At Mumbai, the Maharashtra chapter presented 'Sagun Nirgun' a programme of classical and devotional music by Raghunandan Panshikar and Bhavanesh Komkali at the National Centre for the Performing Centre (NCPA). At Hyderabad, Khader Khan's Hindi play 'Ishwar Allah Tero Nam', directed by Ram Mohan Holagundi was presented by Nishumbita ballet and theatre group at the Prakasham Hall of Gandhi Bhavan. Justice G. Raghuram was chief guest.

The Tamilandu Chapter, in keeping with its efforts to promote Gandhiji's ideals also in the rural

areas, organized its Gandhi Jayanti celebration in collaboration with RIDE (Rural Institute for Development Education) and held it at Sevilimedu, on the outskirts of Kanchipuram. Children of the RIDE



Childrens Club presented a lively programme of songs and dances. The Chief Guest was Sri S. Jeyraj and the keynote address was delivered by Sri K.B. Kumaran.

At Ahmedabad, the Gujarat chapter presented 'Unframed: Gandhiji's Journey though Film and Video by Thetre Director Parnab Mukherjee, prior to which students of Mahatma Gandhi International School sang 'Mahatama Gandhi nous a aide'

The Orissa chapter presented a music concert titled 'Shanti' by the

Hindustani Sangeet Sabha directed by Guru Raghunath Sahoo and Ms Ranjita Senapati. Padmashri Priyambada Mohanty Hejmadi was the Chief Guest on this occasion.

Prakash at the National Library of Brazil, Brazilia on April 29th, the Telugu edition by Mr. Kingshuk Nag, Editor in Chief of Times of India, Hyderabad, at the Gandhi Centre of Osmania University on November 3rd; the updated 2012 Hindi edition by H.E. Mrs. Margaret Alva, Governor of Rajasthan at Raj Bhavan, Jaipur, on January 30, 2013.

The agreement for publication of the Chinese edition was signed at the Embassy of India, Beijing by Mr Yu Dianli, CEO, Commercial Press of Beijing in the presence of H.E. Mr. S. Jaishankar, Ambassador of India to China on July 30, 2012. The first print run of this edition is 3000 books. The Publishers sought, and have been granted, the right to sell these books worldwide.
