

The highlights of the broad spectrum activities during this period were two impactful lectures sponsored by SIT at Bangalore and New Delhi and its Maharashtra Chapter at

Dr. Otis Moss

Mumbai. The first was by Dr. Otis Moss, (a close associate of Martin Luther King) at National Institute of Advanced Studies, Bangalore on January 7, 2010. He spoke on 'The Gandhi-King Impact on Human Rights' and affirmed that humanity now needs to complete the "unfinished cathedral of

goodwill" these great architects of non violence had commenced. The other lecture was that delivered by SIT's Rome based Trustee Dr. Robert Catalano at Gandhi Smriti, New Delhi on January 8th, 2011. It was titled "Gandhi: A Man Inspired by God and a Light to Humanity" and covered many



aspects of Gandhi's striving for perfection and peace. He averred that Gandhi's "great mission was to show the world that non-violence and loving service of humanity was the way to reach God". The same lecture had been delivered at Nehru

Science Museum in Mumbai on January 4th.

The SIT (Andhra Pradersh Chapter) organized a seminar on 'Gandhi and Films' at La Makaan, Hyderabad on September 23, 2010. The portrayal of Gandhi in films by Attenborough, Shyam Benegal, Feroze Abbas Khan Rajkumar Hirani, Ashutosh Gowarikar and Shekar Kammula was discussed, Among the participants were Dr. Raghuram Raju, Mrs Aparajita Sinha, & Mrs Geeta Shyamsundar.

As in previous years, Gandhi Jayanti was joyfully celebrated with concerts of music and dance in Bangalore, Hyderabad, Mumbai, Ahmedabad, Chennai, Goa, Kochi and Bhubaneshwar. Brief details of these concerts, organized by SIT Regional Chapters, are as under:

At Bangalore, the Gandhi Jayanti Ahimsa Mahotsav on October 2nd was nationally telecast by Bangalore Doordarshan Kendra on its Chandana channel. It featured the renowned flutist Praveen Godkindi, a Nada Upasana by the Smt. Shanti Rao Veena

hours before this Mahotsav commenced a Bicycle Rally for Communal Harmony and Environmental protection was held in which approximately 100 cyclists participated.

At Hyderabad, the widely acclaimed 'Mahadevbhai' play by Jaimini Pathak and Ramu Ramanathan was presented on October 2nd along with Gandhiji's favourite bhajans & hymns by Smt. Sangamitra Malik & T. Sarath Chandra and the A.P.Gibbs choir. The Andhra Pradesh Governor H.E. Sri E.S.L. Narasinham and Mrs Narasimhan were chief guests. Earlier that day the Gandhi Clubs Project was launched. These clubs, which are being set up in various schools, would organize inter-class and inter-school quiz, essay and elocution contests on Gandhiji's life and message.

At Mumbai, the Maharashtra chapter presented the 'Mahadevbhai' play at Anjuman-I-Islam Girls School, Bandra on October 1st.

At Chennai a specially choreographed "Mahatma Mahima" Bharatanatyam dance bySmt. Meenakshi Chittaranjan and her disciples was presented by the Tamilnadu chapter at Gandhi Mandapam in Guindy...

At Ahmedabad, the Gujarat chapter presented two short plays titled 'Parable of the Last Post office' and 'Imagine No Possessions' based on writings of Rabindranath Tagore and Khan Abdul Gafar Khan at Natarani Theatre. These plays were performed by the Best of Kolkata Theatre Group

The Goa chapter had a concert of Gandhiji's favourite bhajans and hymns as also an art and poetry contest at Infant Jesus High School, Colva. Admiral (Retd) John D'Silva, former Vice Chief of Naval Staff was Chief Guest and Rev. Diego Fernandes was Guest of Honour.

The Kerala chapter had a Mohini Attam dance presentation by Dharani Dance Academy students at Chevara Cultural Centre, Kochi. Dr, Cyriac Thomas, former Vice Chancellor, Mahatma Gandhi Gandhi University was Chief Guest and Prof. K. Sanu was Guest of Honour.



The Orissa chapter had a vocal music and Odissi dance programme titled 'Ahimsa' presented by the Utkal Choral Group and Smt. Puspita Mishra at
