
The highlights of SIT's activities within India and abroad during this period were the presentation of the Gujarati edition of the widely acclaimed SIT publication 'Gandhi's Outstanding Leadership' to Prime Minsiter Narendra Modi, the releases of its Nepali, Swedish, Dutch, Hungarian and Serbian editions at Kathmandu, Stockholm, Amsterdam, Budapest & Belgrade and the seminar about its German edition at the renowned Heidelberg University.

The Foreword for all the mentioned European language editions has been written by former Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev. An extract from it is as under:

"We live in a world where many old threats to humanity's existence still exist and more challenging and formidable ones have been added to them. People are anxiously looking for a way out of this critical situation. One of the most promising ways of doing so has been indicated by Mahatma Gandhi: humanity should forsake violence.

Leo Tolstoy's writings had a great impact on the youthful Gandhi who read and pondered over them deeply. The great Russian poet Tyutchev, in his poem "Two Unities" has written: "Unity can only be welded by iron and blood some oracles have said. Well, try welding it with love and see which lasts the longer." Even though these lines were written many years ago and in quite a different scenario, its profound message still remains true.

Alan Nazareth has chosen an important aspect of Gandhi's personality to focus on. Even the many who recognize Gandhi as an outstanding figure still consider him to be only a thinker, almost "a dreamer". In his book, the author presents Mahatma Gandhi as an outstanding modern leader, who greatly influenced other leaders during his lifetime and has continued to do so after his death."

As in previous years, Gandhi Jayanti was joyfully celebrated with concerts of music and dance in Bangalore, Bhubaneshwar Chennai, Goa, Hyderabad, Mumbai, New Delhi Ahmedabad, and Jammu. Brief details of some of these concerts, organized by SIT Regional Chapters, are as under:

At Bangalore, the Gandhi Jayanti Ahimsa Mahotsav was held at the Raj Bhavan Glass House and nationally telecast by Bangalore Doordarshan Kendra on its Chandana channel. It featured two Bharatanatyam dance items titled 'Namo, Namo' and 'Gandhi Tathana', folk dances from Afghanistan and Sri Lanka (by Bangalore based foreign students) and Frank Antony High School choir/band presenting Gandhiji's favourite hymns. The Karnataka Governor Sri Vajubhai Vala was Chief Guest. Among the many who attended it were many senior civil / military officers and the Consuls General of UK, Germany & Japan.

The New Delhi Chapter presented 'Dastan -e- Gandhi' (a Dastangi narration of Gandhiji's life') & 'Sounds of Peace' (by Springdales School band), at India International Centre.

The Maharashtra chapter presented Sri Uday Mazumdar with a recital of Gandhiji's favourite bhajans at Bharaituya Vidya Bhavan, Mumbai

The Andhra & Telengana chapter had a specially choreographed ensemble dance titled 'Mahatma', by the Sri Lasya Priya Dance School of Chennai, at Hindi Mahavidyalaya, Hyderabad.

For its 2016 Gandhi Jayanti clebration the Orissa chapter presented the INS CHILIKA Navy and Odisha Military Police bands together in an hour long "Peace Symphony" concert at the Indian Institute of Informatiom Technology, Bhubaneshwar.



The Tamilandu Chapter's Gandhi Jayanti celebration was held at Gnanodaya High School, Venkatapura. Its students put up tableaux of historic events in Gandhi's life.

SIT supported Jaipur Bal Bhavan's multi faceted three day Gandhi Jayanti celebration titled 'Bapu ki Godh me theen din". (three days in Gandhiji's arms), with spinning, elocution and painting contests, clay modeling, singing and dancing and sports

Among the many organizations which supported these Gandhi Jayanti concerts in various state capitals with financial grants and advertisements in the souvenir brochures were Confederation of Indian Industries (CII), Godrej Industries, Apollo Hospitals, Power Grid India, Sharavthy Conductors, Megha Engineering, Kuduma Industries, Ram Ceramics and Ranka Brothers.

Meaningful observances of Gandhiji's martydom day were also held by Regional Chapters at New Delhi, Mumbai, Hyderabad and Bhubaneshwar. The most notable of these



was 'Bapu: The Undying Flame', organized by the New Delhi Chapter at India International Centre at which the distinguished wife of the Vice President of Inida Mrs Salma Ansari was chief Guest.

During 2016 financial assistance was provided by SIT to the following Gandhian and humanitarian institutions in various parts of India:

- v) Rs 10,000 to National Muslim Women Welfare Society, Jaipur.
- vi) Rs. 10,000 to Loyola High School, Zakhama, Nagaland.

Separately, honoraria of US \$ 1000 each was paid to translators of the Dutch, Hungarian, and Swedish editions of the SIT publication 'Gandhi's Oustanding Leadership'


Book Presentations:
